Read on for messages from your teachers ...

### Morning Nursery

Find four pictures that you like e.g. animals, aliens, dinosaurs and print them out. If you prefer (or haven't got a printer) you could draw or paint some pictures (you could make them of African animals). Cut each picture into 5 strips and label the strips from 1-5. Muddle them all up. Take turns to roll a dice with dots on and find the matching strip. Each person collects one picture. If you roll a 6 you miss a turn.

Can you make a giraffe? You could use junk modelling materials, playdough or building blocks. What parts of a giraffe's body will you need to include? You could make a different animal if you like. Giraffes have different shapes blobs on their skin. Can you find any different shapes to do some printing with? You could try to make patterns of skin that the African animals have.



Can you make a letter collection? Do you have any old newspapers, magazines or cereal boxes? Anything with letters on them that your grown up don't mind you cutting up. Look for different letters and cut them out. Remember to name the letters and say the sound. Can you find all the letters on the alphabet? Can you find the letters to make your name? Can you spell any words with the letters you have found? Remember to try to break up the sounds as you make your word. You might also find some numbers and could start a collection of them.

Good morning Reception,

I hope you are having a fabulous week. Did you enjoy doing some drawings yesterday?

Today you have some more Tangram puzzles and some phonics to enjoy. The words on the phonics work are getting a bit tricky now, remember to say each sound and then blend the sounds together - you can do it! You are amazing!



I thought you might enjoy a different challenge today - a cbeebies treasure hunt. You have to find some shiny things (with your grown-ups permission) and then create a treasure hunt map to show where you have hidden the shiny things. Have fun!

I will also post the link on the google classroom for you. Remember once you have finished you must put the shiny things back where they came from - that is very important!
