#### Dates & details!

The dates for the term, and academic year are included at the end of the newsletter. There are a few events where I thought you would appreciate further information, as soon as possible - these are as follows:



#### **Harvest Festival Service**

We will meet at St. Giles Church, at 9.00 a.m. on Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> September for the Harvest Service. Nursery and Reception will be holding their own service in school. Registers will be kept open until 9.30, to help parents who need to drop children in two places.

We support home based and overseas charities on alternate years, and this year will be joining the Bishop's Harvest Appeal, *Cracking Food Poverty Together*. This project supports families in Uganda by providing them with chickens. These give them a sustainable and low cost food source, and also provides a new income stream because they can sell some of their eggs and new chicks that hatch. Their first hatchlings are returned to the project so that another family can benefit. Depending on how much money is raised, some funds might also support other food poverty projects, like planting orchards for schools to supplement the diets of their pupils.

We will be sending home plain envelopes which can be decorated on an egg/chicken theme, with messages added. If you are able to spare some coins to go in the envelopes, that would be appreciated. All envelopes will be brought up to alter during the Harvest service.



## Evening Carol Service with Year 2, 6 & Choir

At the Carol Service, on 18<sup>th</sup> December at 6.30pm, Year 2 will be performing their Nativity Play and their parents and carers are warmly invited to join us. Choir members from Year 6 will be singing carols, and there will be readings from Year 6 children too. Children from Year 6 who do not wish to do readings/are not in Choir, will not need to attend.
