On Thursday 7th March, we will be celebrating World Book day; children (and staff) are invited to come into school in costume. These can be very simple – many books have 'ordinary' characters in them – so please do not go to lots of trouble making elaborate costumes, unless, of course, this is something you enjoy doing.



E-Safety Day

We held a very successful e-safety day on Tuesday, with all of the children showing great interest in the topics covered. They also could talk about the things they can do to stay safe online and many said their parents have set up parental controls on their internet system.

A couple of things came up which we thought would be helpful to draw your attention to. A number of children shared that they regularly play games online, with other people, who they do not know in real life. Some of these games, such as Roblox, have parental safety settings to limit or prevent this, but many children were not aware of this feature. Fortnite, Minecraft and social media platforms can be great for socialising but also allow children to interact with strangers who may be other children or adults.

A relatively high number of children use Snapchat but were not aware that people could see exactly where they were – even down to place in a building – unless they had turned this feature off. Snapchat's age requirement is 13 years old. Users aged 13-17 have additional privacy settings but age verification relies on the age children have used to make an account.

If you have any concerns regarding e-safety, or there is anything we can help you with, please do not hesitate to contact the school office, and they will be able to point you in the direction of the person most able to help.



Cross Country Running
