
## **Nursery and Pre-School Partnership**

We are also very proud of our Year 5 Maths Team, who did extremely well in the first round of the County Year 5 Maths challenge, achieving top marks in one of the rounds and a high score overall. ### **Attendance**


We really value the efforts parents go to, to ensure their children attend school every day. It makes a massive, positive difference to the children’s learning and friendships. Parents may have seen in the media that the Government has announced changes to the laws regarding school attendance. For children who have five days, or 10 half days unauthorised absence in a 10 week period, the fine is increasing to £80 if paid within 21 days, £160 if paid after this time. This means a term time holiday for two children and two parents could incur a fine of up to £640. It is not possible to authorise family holidays. Councils are being strongly encouraged to fine, with attendance data now collected centrally, rather than just recorded at a school level.

The potential to incur a fine is more likely where children’s attendance is below the minimum expected of 95%. I would not wish this to happen to any family, where it could be avoided. To ensure parents are up to speed with the current position in relation to their child, letters will be sent home to any children from Reception to Year 6 where their attendance is below this level. I will not send them to families where a hospital stay has caused this drop in attendance. If you are unsure whether your child should be in school, or which absences can be authorised, please do not hesitate to contact Jen in the School Office, or me.



### **Hindu Day**

As part of our RE curriculum, we will be holding a Hindu Day next Wednesday. The children will be taking part in a wide variety of different activities, which will be led by visitors from the Hare Krishna Temple. I am sure the children will enjoy the day and share the things they have done with you. This day will be funded from the school’s budget.



### **World Book Day – 7<sup>th</sup> March**

Children may come into school dressed as a book character on Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> March – it would be great if they can bring the book in too. If this is not possible, we may have the book in the library. We are avoiding film or comic characters so that we can focus on the books the characters come from.

There will be a book fair after school, every day, starting on Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> March and finishing on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> March. Children will be able to spend their free World Book Day vouchers. Cash and cards will be accepted. The school receives commission, in the form of books, for every book sold, to add to our classrooms and library.



### **Mothering Sunday Shopping**

On Friday 8<sup>th</sup> March, we will be holding the annual Mothering Sunday Shopping morning, starting at 9.00 a.m. where children can buy a gift for their parent. The cost is £3 – it is really helpful if this can be sent into school in a named envelope. If you are able to help at this event, we would love to have you with us. Please let the office know.




### **PTFA Fundraising**
