### Walking to School

Thank you to everyone who has taken part in Walk to School week. It is lovely to see so many people walking/wheeling to school and I appreciate it is a great opportunity to take dogs for a walk at the same time. I have been made aware of some children who feel anxious around dogs; please could people be sensitive to this when tying dogs near school, so that there are not too many in the same location at once and school entry points are clear.

A number of the older children are walking to and from school together regularly, in preparation for independent travel to secondary school. The safest route for many of them includes crossing on St. Albans Road, by the footpath. At present, this is proving to be a challenge, as a number of cars are parking on the yellow lines, which prohibit parking between certain times. This means the children are having to step into the road to see if it is clear to cross making it more of a challenge for them. I would rather that this was addressed by the drivers themselves to ensure the safety of our children. Please be considerate when parking around the school area – even if it means you have to walk further and are a little bit late for collection.
