Athletics

We were absolutely delighted with their attitude, determination and support of each other – the older children took particular care to tell me how well the younger ones had done. We are very grateful to all of the parents who helped us with transport and to Miss Doran (athletics coach) and Mrs Brown for leading the team!



Lost Property

Summer Do!

Tickets are available for the Summer Do!, at which takes place on Saturday 29^{th} June, from 6.30 p.m. until late! The price of £7 for children and £15 for adults includes the barbecue and entertainment. Tickets can be purchased via School Gateway, or with cash in the school office. If you have already purchased tickets, these will be sent home next week in your child's bag. Children from Dance Club and Musical Performance Club will be performing at approximately 8.00 p.m. Details to follow.

Changes to Attendance laws

I know a number of people are already thinking about holiday plans for next year. As I have previously mentioned, new laws regarding unauthorised absences will be in place from September. These are as follows:

- A fine can be issued when a child has an unauthorised absence of 5 days or more.
- Fines are £80 per child, per parent, if paid within 21 days. The amount increased to £160 is paid between 22 and 28 days. If still not paid, it is referred to court.
- If a parent receives a second fine for the same child within 3 years, the fine increases to £160 per child, per parent, if paid within 21 days. After this, a parenting order or prosecution is considered. Prosecution can result in a £2,500 fine.
- All money goes directly to the local authority to pay for the attendance improvement system.
- There is no right of appeal.

Term time holidays cannot be authorised. If you are considering taking your child out of school during term time, please do not hesitate to contact me to discuss this; I would not wish anyone to incur a fine (or worse) unwittingly.



We hope you can come along to our open evening on Tuesday 9th July from 4.30 to 6.30 p.m.. This is an opportunity for your child to take you round the school – visiting their current classroom and looking round the rest of the school. This year, there will be catwalk performance of the Year 6 Hats in the atrium in the new building at 5.30 p.m – they are amazing!



School starts at 8.50a.m., and the children are busy from the time they arrive – most days, there is a lesson before assembly starts, on key skills such as spelling or phonics for reading. We appreciate that there will be times when lateness is unavoidable, but being punctual each day really does have a positive impact on every child's learning. If you face particular challenges in arriving on time, please do contact us and we can work with you to help.

Thank you very much to everyone who has let us know that their child will be able to sing at Café Church on 7th July. We really need some more people, so if your child is able to take part, we would love to have them with us. Children do not need to belong to choir and can be from any year group.
