

#### **Sports Days**

We aim to continue with Sports Days irrespective of the weather – unless it is dangerous for the children to take part. We know that children really look forward to their races, and that parents have had to organise their diaries in order to attend. ## **Uniform Reminder**

Good quality donated school uniform will be available for parents to take on Sports Day, as part of our recycling targets. For parents buying uniform, items are available from either the school supplier – <u>Uniform Monkeys in Letchworth</u> – or local shops and supermarkets.

The uniform is as follows:

- Navy blue skirt, pinafore dress, culottes or trousers, or grey trousers/shorts.
- Pale blue/navy polo shirt\*
- Navy blue jumper/sweatshirt/cardigan/school fleece\*
- White, grey or navy socks/tights
- Sensible black flat shoes
- Blue/white check dresses or playsuits (summer)

## P.E. Clothing

All Children require plimsolls or trainers for outdoor games. P.E. uniform is as follows:

- Navy Round-necked T Shirt with school logo\*
- Navy Shorts
- Navy Sweatshirt/Navy track suits bottoms for cold weather
