Harvest

Thank you very much for your support for our Harvest Service. Thank you for your patience waiting at church – we were slightly delayed due to a delivery vehicle blocking our gate which refused to move! However, we had a wonderful welcome when we arrived, and it was a pleasure to have Catherine and the St. Giles Team with us, to lead the service. The children delighted us all with their singing and range of contributions, including poetry, sign language, presentations and prayers. Homework Policy

We reviewed our homework policy a few years ago, taking into account, parental feedback. There is always an element of compromise, as some families would like more homework, some less and some different types of homework. Our priorities for any home learning have always been reading practice – children having the opportunity to read to you regularly, and being read to. We know that these two things make a significant

difference to the children's reading development and writing skills. Practice in learning spellings, basic number bonds and times tables, is also invaluable.

As children move through the school, an increasing amount of tasks involving preparation for lessons – and independent research is set. We try to avoid an emphasis on activities requiring IT, as we are aware that not all children have easy access to a computer they can work from, and can always provide alternative ways of completing work. We also have a bank of devices we are able to loan out for projects in Year 6.

Menu Choices

Thank you to everyone who has been making the children's menu choices online via School Gateway – we would be really grateful if everyone could make their choices in advance. The benefits are: you and your child are able to make the choices together, the right quantity of food can be ordered and it gives back 10 minutes of teaching time each morning if choices don't need to be made on the day. We will always check in with the children if choices haven't been made, but really appreciate your help.



Birthday Sweets

We have always enjoyed celebrating birthdays at school and children have often brought sweets to share with the class. We have now come to the difficult decision this will no longer be allowed in the light of a tragic event at one of our local schools. A child died at home, from anaphylactic shock, having eaten some sweets given out by a classmate. Whilst this is an isolated incident, it makes sense to do all we can to keep everyone safe.

We do want to make sure that Birthdays are still recognised however, so are going to 'up the anti' by including birthdays in assembly and we will give out birthday stickers too. Children are very welcome to come to school wearing badges, sashes and headbands, as many of them do at present.



World Mental Health Day

Tuesday 10th October is World Mental Health Day and the charity, Young Minds, is holding a 'Hello Yellow' day. If children would like to wear something yellow – perhaps a badge, hairband, top, sticker, item of clothing – they are welcome to. However, please do not go out and buy anything!

We are not requesting any donations for school – particularly given the recent Harvest Collection.
