#### **Reading Challenge**

Back by popular demand, we are hoping to read all the way around the world and be back by Christmas! This is how it works: next week, your child will be bringing a reading challenge card home with their reading book. Every time they read aloud to you equates to 10km of travel. There are up to 5 spaces each week for you to initial – obviously they can read more than 5 times a week! In Nursery, you can initial the card when you read to your child.

On Mondays, the totals for every child in every class will be added up, and on Tuesday, in assembly, we will see how far we can go! We will also celebrate the classes and houses who help us to travel the furthest. We would like all children from Years R to 6 to read aloud, even if they are free readers, as it really helps them to take note of punctuation and add expression in their reading. Everyone contributes, however many times they read - it all counts!

There are lots of fun and exciting fiction and non-fiction books in our library and classrooms, as well as reading scheme books for the children to bring home. If your child appears to be struggling to find something they enjoy, please let us know and we will be happy to help them find a book they like.

# The right technology at the right time

Parents may be aware of a national and local initiative regarding delaying giving children a smartphone until the most appropriate point at secondary school. There has been information in the press regarding how this has worked in St. Albans and parents at some of our local schools have signed up to this initiative. This week, a parent and I attended a meeting at William Ransom School, regarding how this initiative could work across our local schools. There are obviously many factors to consider, so going forward, we will be sharing further information for parents to consider whether this is something which they would like to be part of.



#### **Climbing Frames**

I have not mentioned the use of climbing frames in the newsletter for some time, so thought it would be helpful to explain the system we have in place. Equipment is not used before school. After school, we have always liked the fact that people are not in a rush to leave school. Whilst under their parent/carers' supervision,

Foundation and Key Stage 1 children are able to play on the KS1 climbing frame. Key Stage 2 children may play on the bottom playground climbing frame - children below Year 3 are not permitted as the equipment is designed for older children. The bottom playground and equipment then need to be vacated when the gate is closed, so that the 326 children can play outside. If you have any questions regarding this, please do not hesitate to ask me.



## Breakfast Club and 326 After School Club

Over time our costs for 326 have risen but we have managed to keep the charges to families the same; in the 19 years we have been running 326, we have only increased the charges twice. However, we are now in a position where we need to increase the fees, in order to make sure the clubs are sustainable. We have kept these as low as possible, and they are still much lower than other clubs in the area. Although Breakfast Club will be increasing by 50p too, we will be opening from 7.30 a.m. after Christmas – following feedback from parents.
