### **Climbing Frames**

As you will be aware, we have always been happy for children, parents and carers to socialise on the playgrounds after school, before going home, and for children to play on the apparatus under their adult's supervision. It has been some time since I sent out information regarding the age restrictions, so thought it would be helpful to provide this.

The equipment on the middle playground can be used by Year 1 and 2 children only – older children are not able to use it to reduce the likelihood of accidentally injuring a younger one. The equipment on the bottom playground may only be used by children in Years 3 to 6, as this is the age range it is designed for. We appreciate that some younger children are very agile, and may be able to use it safely, however, it is not possible to make allowances on an individual basis.

When the children from 326 come outside after their snack, the gate to the footpath is closed, and the climbing frame needs to be cleared so that the staff have clear oversight over the children they are responsible for. Thank you for your support.
