This could be crisps, fruit or a sandwich and a drink. The whole staff team and regular helpers will be accompanying us so that we have a high ratio of adults to children. I am sure we will have a great time – oh yes we will!



## **Carol Service**

The Carol Service takes place on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> December at 6.30 p.m. at St. Giles. Doors open at 6.15p.m. The children from Year 2 will be sharing their nativity play as part of the service and some of the Year 6 children will be giving readings. The children from Choir in Years 5 & 6 will also be performing two carols. Children from Year 6 who are not singing or doing readings do not need to attend.



#### **Christmas parties**

The dates and times for the Christmas parties are shown in the countdown to Christmas table. We will provide a drink and a snack (catering for individual dietary needs) so will not be requesting any donations of food. Children may bring party clothes to school to change into – Reception and Nursery can wear these to school on their party days.



It has been an absolute pleasure to hear and see the children rehearsing their Christmas plays, and I know they are looking forward to performing these for you. Entry is free and tickets are not needed. The PTFA will be running a series of raffles at each event, with all proceeds going towards paying for the new stage lights. The arrangements for each play are as follows:

Nursery & Reception: Doors will open at 10.15a.m. for a 10.30 a.m. start. Year 1: Doors will open at 2.15p.m. for a 2.30 p.m. start.

# KS 2:

- 6.30p.m.: Main office door opens Years 3 and 4 go to their classrooms to get changed. Year 5 and 6 children whose parents are watching the Year 3/4 play can go to their classrooms to wait. Audience members take their seats in the hall from 6.30.
- 7.00p.m.: Year 3 & 4 play starts.
- 7.30p.m.: Year 5 & 6 children arrive to get into their costumes. Entry is through the double doors next to 326. Audience members for the play are welcome to wait in the Year 1 classroom.
- 7.45p.m. (approx.): 1<sup>st</sup> Raffle will be drawn. Year 3 and 4 children will go back to their classrooms to get changed, and will meet their parents in the courtyard outside the new building. If they are joining their parents to watch older siblings, they can come back into school through the double doors.
- 7.50p.m.(approx.): Years 5 & 6 play starts.
- End of evening: 2<sup>nd</sup> raffle drawn. Year 5 & 6 children go to their classroom to get changed and then return to the hall to meet up with their parents.

We are happy for photographs and videos to be taken; we appreciate how precious these memories are. However, any images taken cannot be shared on social media sites; there are a number of children for whom appearing on the internet could compromise their safety. I am sure that you will understand this, and share the message with any other friends and relatives attending. Thank you for your support.




#### **Smart Phones update**
