### **School Plays**

We look forward to sharing the children's plays with you next week. Entry is free; the PTFA will be running a series of raffles for anyone wishing to take part.

- Nursery & Reception: Doors will open at 10.15a.m.
- Year 1: Doors will open at 2.15p.m.

Details for the KS 2 plays are shown below.

- 6.30p.m.: Main reception door opens Years 3 and 4 go through the hall and out through the double doors to go to their classrooms to get changed. Year 5 and 6 children whose parents are watching the Year 3/4 play can go to their classrooms to wait. Audience members take their seats in the hall from 6.30.
- 7.00p.m.: Year 3 & 4 play starts.
- 7.30p.m.: Year 5 & 6 children need to arrive to get into their costumes. They can go through the double doors from the playground side to go across to their classrooms. Audience members for their play are welcome to wait in the Year 1 classroom.
- 7.45p.m. (approx.): Year 3 and 4 children will go back to their classrooms to get changed, and can meet their parents in the courtyard outside their classrooms if they are going home. If they are joining parents to watch older siblings, they will come back into the hall.
- 1<sup>st</sup> Raffle will be drawn.
- 7.50p.m.: Years 5 & 6 play starts.
- End of evening: 2<sup>nd</sup> raffle drawn. Year 5 & 6 children go to their classroom to get changed and then return to the hall to meet up with their parents.

#### Attendance

There is a lot in the press at the moment about research showing the impact of low attendance on children's learning, social skills, mental health and general well-being. As a result, the local authority School Attendance Officers have increased expectations placed on them by the government to address low attendance and in many areas, there has been a sharp rise in the amount of fines issued, and even prosecutions which have gone to court.

We are very keen to work with families to ensure they are not in this position, and to overcome any barriers to attending school. Attendance is expected to be above 95%. If it falls below this, it is hard for children to catch up with their learning; a week missed means 5 phonics lessons, 5 hours of maths and 5 hours of literacy missed, as well as learning in the other subjects taught. It also means that children get out of the routine of school and learning, and can increase any feelings of anxiety and impact of friendships.

Children are expected to be in school every day, unless they are ill. If they have a temperature or an illness such as chicken pox, they need to be at home. For sickness and diarrhoea, they must be off school for 48 hours after the last episode to prevent the illness spreading to others. They are able to be in school with coughs and colds. If they need to take prescribed medicine, or other medication such as Calpol, during the school day, we are able to administer this, provided the appropriate form has been filled out with the school office. All medication should be in the original container, and prescription labels need to be on bottles/boxes. As part of my statutory duties, and keep families up to date, I will write to families where their child's attendance is below 95%.at the start of next term. Whilst absences caused by illness may be unavoidable, this may help you decide if you are considering any events during term time. If there is anything we can support you with, regarding supporting attendance, please do not hesitate to contact either me, or the School Office.
